Thank you so much for raising funds for us throughout Lent - we appreciate it so much and are so glad to have you on the team tackling child hunger in Milton Keynes.



PRAYER: PART 1

How do you do it?

I have been a part of the St Edward's community since autumn 1985 when our shepherd was Fr John Murphy and we celebrated mass in a variety of rented venues. I'm a Lay Associate of the Holy Family of Bordeaux and knowing God through Jesus Mary and Joseph is our aim.

The Eucharist is a very important part of my prayer as is the awareness of God in nature. For me prayer is conversation with God. Sometimes with formal prayers learned as a child, others by simply being aware of God's presence in nature and in the people I interact with.

Before getting out of bed I offer my day and my family and friends living and dead to God. I may name them and any special needs I'm aware of. I try to read the daily mass readings and when possible attend mass. I belong to a couple of prayer groups one a house group and the other is our local Praisefest.

I am a bit of a 'chatterer'. I talk to God as I go about my day. Asking for blessings including parking space! Sometimes I pray the prayers or sing the hymns to Mary I learned as a child. I like The Freedom Rosary and some little chaplets. I don't do much meditation during my day. I just try and remember to say hello to God and to praise and thank Him for the gifts he gives me throughout the day. I may play hymns in the car or pray with friends on the phone or in person. I may pray the news if a particular situation draws me.

My aim is to build a relationship with God. Sometimes I go through the whole day and the only prayer I've remembered to say is those offered in bed. I love trees and I often sit on my sofa and watch the trees dancing in the breeze amazed by their wonder. I also love to be by the sea. To be reminded, as the waves lap or crash upon the shore, of the power and wonder of the God who made me and all the beauty around me and who takes care of me and those who walk through life with me. *Jo Doherty*.
